



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Salt Lake Shriners Children's Clinic

The Shriners Childrens Clinic in Salt Lake City continues to work toward their mission of providing patients with "The Best Care Anywhere."

The Philanthropy Department raised \$295,048 in April for a YTD of \$1,440,890 which is 32.02% of their goal for the year and 7.5 percent over 2023 at this time last year. Overall expenses were \$288,573 and under budget by 6.9%. Total outpatient charges were \$3,648,061 with collections on out-patient charges at 16.8% with net revenue at \$613,389.

Staffing remains fairly stable with 2 on-boarded and 2 off-boarded resulting in a 2.04% turnover. HR Strategic planning continues to try and fill positions, Radiology Techs are an extremely difficult position to fill as there is an overall shortage across the country. Future new employee starts include a Senior Director of Philanthropy and a Computer Technician.

There were 91 clinics held during the 22 available days in April. There were 823 unique patient visits in April. There were 33 no-shows (4%) for an overall show rate for appointments of 96%. There were 54 surgical procedures performed, and 5 infusions. There were 473 Therapy Services performed. The Orthotics and Prosthetics Department delivered 309 Orthotics and 7 Prosthetics for a total of 316 devices delivered. The wheelchair department worked on 73 wheelchairs for the month.

Two external storage units were eliminated and the material moved to storage onsite as a cost reduction activity, with material from one storage unit left to be moved onsite.

The new medical records system (EPIC) has seen 50% of patients utilizing MyChart since January 1, 2024. The Press Ganey score increased to 93.45% in April, up from 91.3% in March.

There were no confirmed cases of COVID reported in April.

Employee Kathy Kelly Huston celebrated 40 years of service in April 2024.

Services were provided to over 600 unique patients during the month and included clinics, surgeries, infusions, etc. There were 19 patients treated in the Motion Analysis Lab and 540 radiology exams performed. There were 305 Orthotics and 10 Prosthetics devices delivered, for a total of 315 devices delivered from the Prosthetics Lab. The wheelchair and seating department reworked 55 new and donated wheelchairs, and made growth adjustments on 38 wheelchairs and cars seats. Progress was made for MyChart/EPIC electronic patient record activations, hitting 46% which is near the 50% goal.

Thanks to generous donors, the clinic is able to hold Camp Un-Limb-ited activities outside the facility, this camp provides outdoor experiences for children with amputations. This year there were campers from a number of states including Utah, Colorado, Idaho, Minnesota and as far away as Pennsylvania that participated in the Winter camp.

Staffing at the clinic remains stable with only one employee resigning and two new employees coming onboard for a vacancy rate of only 7.8%. Volunteers at the Clinic donated 55 hours during the month of February.

Portland Shrine Hospital Report

The Portland Shrine Hospital had a slightly slower April than expected but May has already started strong. The number of inpatient and outpatient surgeries were almost as high as they have been in the past year. Net patient revenue is only slightly under budget on a year to date basis and total income is almost on par with budget. The case mix score (measuring acuity or how critical they are) is still under previous years on a year to date basis due to decreased numbers of spine surgeries.

The new clinic in Redmond, OR is starting off strong and the current two days per week the clinic is open may not be enough.

Come Play in the Desert June 1, 2024 El Korah's Fun Ride!

The fun starts on Friday May 31, 2024 with the Clubs and Units and other workers arriving to set up operations. We'll need to run the route and put out trail signs, course markers and lay out the check points and registration area. Those who want to camp onsite and hang out with the Shriners are welcome join us. It's dry camping, but it is free. The El Korah Nomads are planning on several of there rigs being there.

On Saturday, we will start welcoming guests. Registration opens at 8:30 am. There will be raffle items and silent action items for people to check out and bid on as they get ready to go. Breakfast items will also be available for purchase. After a safety briefing at 9:30, the riders will start hitting the trail at 9:40 am.

As riders finish their ride and return to the registration area, they'll be able to continue their bidding on the silent auction items, buy more raffle tickets and enjoy dinner items for purchase. The silent auction ends at 4:30 pm, which is when silent auction and raffle items will be awarded and the winners of the Fun Ride will be announced.

Then the real fun starts. We'll begin the break down of the registration area and then ramp up for an evening of relaxing and visiting.

On Sunday morning, we'll run the course again to cleanup the route and retrieve the trail signs and markers and tear down any remnants of the check points, making sure to return everything to their pre-event conditions.

I have met with the public promoting the Fun Ride and have received many positive responses. I spoke with the Mountain Home ATV Club and the Canyon County, Boise and Kuna ATV/UTV groups and many of them are already signed up.

We are still seeking sponsors for the check points that the riders must pass through in order to draw their numbers. We have a couple sponsors, but need three more.

Chaplain's Corner

LISTENING: We can shut our eyes to the light and we can chain our lips, but the ear is always ready to receive. Then our mind can reflect.

It might be the musical song of the Lark at Sunrise, the rooster welcoming the day for us, the

brook bringing the sound of peace, or the whispering branches in the wind telling us that all is well. Bells of all kinds like Churchs and Schools (start, stop, tardy), tinkling symbols, Words spoken, (whispered, shouted, tipped with sarcasm, gentle kindness). So the ear is our connection to the present moment. It only receives and does not communicate.

One of my favorite Zoology Classes at the U of I was an Ornithology Class where we learned to identify birds by their sounds. Professor Larison would walk us through the Arboretum and say "LISTEN, that is a Western Tanager." It was really not a class, but a life experience and a great lesson in really listening.

Listening is paying attention to those vibrations and being in communication with them, using our whole body.

Certain low frequency bass sounds are felt by our body and

not heard. Reflect on the difference between being at a live concert, listening to Alexa play that tune, or just hearing through headphones. Headphones will not convey the same as the live band experience. Let's improve our listening skills by receiving a full register of what lessons the sound vibrations are bringing to us.

What can block our listening skills and stop the flow of information? Our critical mind often jumps into agreeing with our own preconceived ideas and rejecting what we do not agree with. This keeps us from really listening. Trying to justify our thoughts distracts us and blocks out words, sounds and vibrations that we should hear and feel.

A goal would be to pay attention without preconceived ideas. Keep an open MIND to music, sculptures, paintings, poetry, yoga, scriptures, or any art form that helps us grow into a better society.

By going beyond our natural reflexive response we might find the oneness that connects all things. Listening then becomes more than mere awareness. It is freedom from accepted limitations.

Lastly, Men of my Clan, it is more than keeping eye contact and nodding in approval of words being spoken. Listening with love in your heart receiving the gift of really hearing.

The Importance of Positive Communication to Children with Disabilities

The Power of Language

Our word choices have a tremendous impact on those around us. Children, especially, are deeply influenced by the language surrounding them – who they become is based on who they are learning to be. The staff of Shriners Hospitals for Children® understands the importance of building confidence and self-esteem in our patients at an early age. Our staff recognizes that while working with children with disabilities, it is imperative to help them develop a strong positive attitude so they will have the confidence to pursue their dreams. To accomplish this, being mindful of the effect language has on children is critical.

Two essential points in using communication as affirmation are accurate wording and people-first language. Always remember to use language that encourages, rather than discourages, the individual. When referring to those with a disability, please remember to avoid labels with a negative connotation, such as:

- crippled
- handicapped
- lame
- deformed

» The preferred word choice is usually:

- disability
- disabled
- the actual term involved, such as, cerebral palsy or muscular dystrophy

People with Disabilities are People First

The second key element of communicating with people with disabilities is the need to use "people-first language," where the person is the important element, rather than the disability.

For example, try using phrases such as "a person with cerebral palsy" or "a person who uses a prosthetic arm," rather than defining them by the disability itself.

It is also important to recognize that people are individuals, and to avoid lumping those with disabilities together into one group, like "the disabled," "the spinal cord injured," or to refer to "all people with X."

- » Another important aspect of using people-first language is to avoid negative descriptive phrases and terms, such as:
 - o confined to a wheelchair
 - wheelchair bound
 - victim stricken with
 - suffering

Instead, try saying a person "uses a wheelchair," or "has cerebral palsy."



"We must take language very seriously. The feeling I have is that language is always a reflection of attitude. With the advancement of the disability movement, you see a change in language." – Michael Masutha

Also avoid **value-laden words and phrases**, whether negative or positive, because even seemingly positive labels such as "courageous" and "inspirational" can be burdensome to a child, setting unnecessary high expectations, that may be hard to maintain.

As part of using people-first language, it is also imperative to not define people by their disabilities. This is accomplished by **emphasizing abilities**, **not limitations**.

- » For instance:
 - Say: "Darlene is an excellent writer," rather than, "Despite her disability, Darlene is an excellent writer."
 - Say, "Johnny is a child with a disability," instead of the defining, "Johnny is a disabled child."

Being mindful of preferred disability terminology and using people-first language whenever possible will help children with disabilities become more confident and able to become successful, productive adults.


