





Portland Shrine Hospital Report

The Portland Shrine Hospital had a very robust July with total surgeries being the highest they have been all year.

Outpatient surgeries continues to be above budget and we matched our year to date monthly high in inpatient surgeries. Net patient revenue is only slightly under budget on a year to date basis and but total income is over \$800,000 higher than budget. We remain second only to NorCal in terms of net patient revenue.

We also measure the total draw on the endowment per patient, and have reached a point where it is the lowest it has ever been, drawing only \$692 per patient currently when it was nearly \$2,000 per patient in 2018.

The new clinic in Redmond, OR is starting off strong and the current two days per week the clinic is open may not be enough. The Medford clinic is continuing to see more and more patients.

Salt Lake Shriners Children's Clinic

The Shriners Children's Clinic in Salt Lake City continues to work toward their mission of providing patients with "The Best Care Anywhere".

The Philanthropy Department raised \$66,217 in May for a YTD of \$1,704,792 which is 37.9% of their goal for the year, +6.2 over 2023 at this time last year. Overall expenses were \$326,359 and under budget by 5.2%. Total outpatient charges at \$5,496,315 with collections on out-patient charges at 17.2% with net revenue at \$945,421.

Staffing remains stable with 5 on-boarded and 1 off-boarded, a 0.0% turnover, there is still a 6.0% vacancy rate for unfilled positions. HR Strategic planning continues to try and fill positions, Radiology Techs being difficult to fill as there is an overall shortage across the country. Two employees received their 20 year Service Awards. Market HR changes were made in July as some positions were consolidated from individual

Medical Facilities to our Market Group consisting of Salt Lake, Portland, and Spokane. They are continuing to work on 2025 Budget preparation.

There were 72 clinics held during the 20 available days clinic days in June. There were 668 unique patient visits in June. There were 49 no-shows (7.3%) for an overall show rate for appointments of 92.6%. There were 48 surgical procedures performed, and 3 infusions. The Orthotics and Prosthetic Department delivered 333 Orthotics and 20 Prosthetics for a total of 353 devices delivered. The wheelchair department worked on 122 wheelchairs for the month.

They have reached 59% of patients activated MyChart since January 1, 2024. The Press Ganey score was 92.59% in June.

There were 3 staff members confirmed with COVID in June.

The Walk for Love event will be held in Salt Lake City on Saturday September 21st. I have included an attachment with a link for accessing the registration for the event, there is also an option to participate in the Walk for Love event virtually if you are not able to attend the event in person.

Shriners Children's and the El Korah Patient Travel Fund

The Shriners Magazine publishes a report each summer about the Shriners Children's Hospitals. The 2023 report stressed the importance of Shriners Children's as a research and outreach hospital for the treatment of our kids.

Shriners Children's doctors held clinics in many areas outside the United States including El Salvador, Panama, the Pacific Basin, Puerto Rico, and Cyprus, which was the largest one because they saw children from Egypt, Greece, Jordan, Nigeria and Turkey. In total, they saw more than 300 patients and performed 111 complex surgeries in collaboration with local physicians. More than 80 children received braces and prosthetics.

"At the Shriners Children's Genomics Institute, researchers are taking genetic samples from patients who choose to participate to sequence thousands of genomes each year." This research is assisting our researchers to help kids with cerebral palsy and scoliosis. There are plans for this information helping with other situations like scoliosis, spina bifida, cerebral palsy, burn care, pain management and much more.

In 2023, Shriners Children's:

- · Served patients from all 50 States and 108 counties
- · Provided 23,902 life-changing surgeries
- · Provided 347,839 Rehabilitation procedures
- Had 14,238 Telehealth encounters
- Had 51,852 prosthetic and orthotic services
- Saw over 57,000 new patients

El Korah's role in helping Shriners Children's is to provide funds for patients to travel to the appropriate Shrine hospital. In 2023, El Korah:

- · Helped 112 Idaho children
- · Sent patients to 212 hospital visits
- Spent a total of \$77,927 from the Patient Travel Fund on travel expenses
- Provided these travel services without regard to the patients' parents ability to pay

These annual El Korah events support the Patient Travel Fund:

- The Treasure Valley area East/West High School All Star Football game held in the Boise area at Thanksgiving
- The Magic Valley area North/South High School All Star Football game in the Twin Falls area held on Memorial Day

Saturday morning broke out bright and pleasant as the Fun

Paramedics were summoned and determined that her break was very serious and that she needed to be taken by Life Flight to a Boise hospital.

As a followup, Darcy broke her ankle in four places and required surgery. Her ankle had to be pinned together. After a few days in the hospital she went home for recovery. She is excited for next year's Fun Ride and has even offered her Club's assistance to help set it up.

After the crawl section, the rest of the riders continued their ride.





As riders finished the Fun Ride and returned back to start area, they were met by Shriners who had hamburgers, hot dogs and beverages waiting for them. Lunch was prepared by Mitch & Sue Davis, Dennis & Vicky Johnson, and Jerri Mizrahi-Drewes.

El Korah Shrine Circus

We had a great 2024 Circus. Roughly 5,900 people attended 12 performances the 6 days at various venues and show times. We made about \$55,000 (so far), which is a little less than 2023. I believe all of the revenue and most of the expenses have been captured. Another circus was at the Boise Towne Square for the two weeks before the Shrine Circus started and may have impacted our attendance at the Boise shows.

We had a few changes this year with the acts and the venues. We had elephants acts for the first time in several years and a new bison act. We changed venues from Gooding to the newly rebuilt grandstands in Jerome, which turned out to be the top daily performance for the year in both attendance and revenue. We also changed from the indoor arena at the Ford Idaho Center in Nampa to the outdoor grandstands at EXPO Idaho in Garden City. This saved about \$9,000 over the 3 days in Boise.

At several of the performances, we had Shriners Children's patients from the local area drawing the tickets for the bike raffles. We had a great group of volunteers helping with the Circus this year, including several Idaho Grand Lodge officers, our elected and appointed Divan, and many members of the Nobility. There are too many to name here, but thanks to everyone who came out to help and to support the El Korah Shrine Circus!

Providing Care for Cleft Lip and Palate at Shriners Hospitals for Children

Cleft lip and palate deformities occur when the tissue that forms the upper lip and roof of the mouth fail to join together before birth. Babies may be born with a cleft lip only, a cleft palate only, or both. No two facial clefts are ever the same.

Clefts of the lip and palate, which vary in size because the lips and palate develop at different times, are complex conditions that affect the ability to breathe, speak, hear and eat properly. The condition can also impact patients' appearance and self-esteem. Cleft lip and palate is corrected by reconstructive surgery in conjunction with multidisciplinary therapies.

The condition occurs in approximately one of every 600 live births. In fact, facial clefts are one of the most common birth defects in the U.S. Despite the frequency of its occurrence, and the severity of the deformities, complete care for patients with cleft lip and palate can be difficult to obtain. For this reason, Shriners Hospitals for Children[®] added cleft lip and palate to the health care system's treatment disciplines.

A Positive Outcome

At Shriners Hospitals for Children, patients with a cleft lip and/or palate are treated by a multidisciplinary team of experts, who work together to solve the many issues associated with this complex condition. Each patient's unique treatment plan may include surgery, orthodontics, hearing, speech and psychological therapies, along with specialized support. The goal of our treatment program is to help each child achieve optimal function, improve their facial appearance to the fullest extent possible, and improve their self-esteem.

Our medical experts also emphasize family-centered care. Patients and families are treated as members of the team and are invited to be active participants in the treatment planning and decision making process. Our goal is to foster and maximize the social, physical, and psychological development of our patients.

Overcoming Challenges



Yana is one patient who has benefited from the expertise in cleft lip and palate care available at Shriners Hospitals for Children. She was born with a severe case of cleft lip and palate, and finding the care she required proved difficult - early attempts of physicians to address Yana's condition were unsuccessful. When she was 13, she was referred to

the cleft lip and palate team at Shriners Hospitals for Children – Shreveport. Under the expert care of Dr. G.E. Ghali, Yana underwent a series of operations involving her palate, nose, teeth, jaw and cheekbones. "Overall, my speech went from about 4 to a 10 in being able to understand it," Yana said. "And the team was always willing to go out of their way to help make me comfortable."

With vastly improved speech, Yana began participating in public speaking events. She earned a spot in a Texas state competition and took first place, and then went on to compete and win first place in a national tournament in Georgia, where she spoke of people who have fought in the face of adversity, told of her own life experiences, and discussed the role of faith as she looks toward a bright future.

Cleft lip and palate is a common and serious condition. Shriners Hospitals for Children is committed to improving care for children with this condition through a comprehensive, coordinated program of clinical excellence, medical education, and research.

Potentate Appoints Futures Committee

Ill Sir Ric Bobier recently appointed a Futures Committee and charged them with exploring the possible avenues open to our Shrine for the replacement of the El Korah Shrine building. The Committee members are Ill Sir Gary Adams, Ill Sir Dave Thomas, and Nobles Bob Julian, Gene Strate and Gary Betts.

The Committee felt the first option to consider should be to construct an addition or modification of the existing Boise Masonic Center building at Westgate. The Committee has met twice with the Masonic Temple Association and has received their assurance that El Korah would be welcome to explore a joint venture at their location. The Committee has also met twice with the Elected Divan.

A local Architect has been retained to conduct a Feasibility Study to determine if this project is feasible. The study will identify all the necessary permits required by governmental bodies and determine if their needs can be met. These will include building setback and parking requirements as well as the possible locations of the proposed structure (whether separate from the existing structure or attached thereto). The sole purpose of this study is to determine whether it is feasible to proceed to the next planning phase of the project.

If the study determines that building on this site is not feasible, then the Committee will begin exploring other options. The completion date for this Feasibility Study is not known at this time, but information will be shared with the Nobility as it becomes available.
