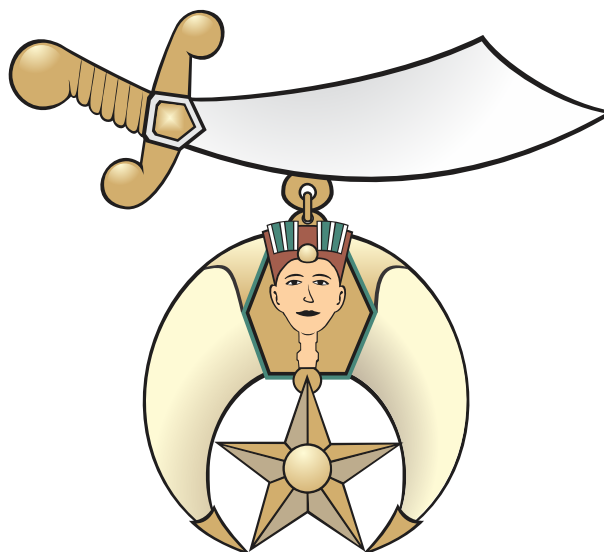

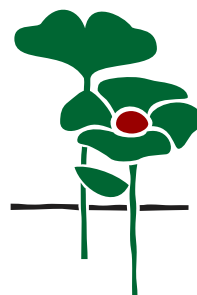

Salt Lake Shriners Children's Clinic

The Shriners Children's Clinic in Salt Lake City continues to work toward their mission of providing patients with "The Best Care Anywhere", and "taking care of more kids in more places at a lower overall cost".

View the Hunter Woodall article, an August Social Media Highlight from Shriners Children's Clinic in Salt Lake City: "We made a [reel documenting Hunter Woodhalls time](#) with us as a patient and wished him good luck in Paris".

The Northwest Shrine Hospital Market (Salt Lake City, Portland, and Seattle) had 8,021 New Patient Visits so far this year. The Salt Lake Shriners Children's Clinic is trending upward with 147 New Patient Visits in August.

The Philanthropy Department raised \$138,948 in August for a YTD of \$1,967,768 which is 43.7% of their goal for the year. Overall expenses were

\$291,336 and under budget by 3.4%. Total outpatient charges at \$7,631,492 with collections on out-patient charges at 17.3% with net revenue at \$1,321,240.

Staffing remains relatively stable with 2 on-boarded and 4 off-boarded, a 4.0% turnover, there is a 4.6% vacancy rate for unfilled positions.

There were 73 clinics held during the 22 available clinic days in August with 780 unique patient visits. There were 31 no-shows (4%) for an overall show rate for appointments of 96%. There were 50 surgical procedures performed, and 4 infusions. The Orthotics and Prosthetics Department delivered 423 Orthotics and 11 Prosthetics for a total of 434 devices delivered. The wheelchair department worked on 131 wheelchairs and adjusted 12 car seats for the month for a total treatment of 143.

They have reached 55.1% of patients activated MyChart since January 1, 2024. The Press Ganey score was 93.16% in August.

Nine staff members tested positive for COVID in August.

The Walk for Love event was held in Salt Lake City on Saturday September 21st.

Influencing Treatment and Improving Lives through Research

Conducting contemporary, meticulous and innovative research to improve patient care and enhance medical knowledge of injury and disease is one of the three parts of the overall mission of Shriners Hospitals for Children®.

What began as a small research effort with a budget of \$12,000 is now a multimillion-dollar sophisticated program that involves peer review of grant applications and is recognized around the world. Over the years, our researchers have made significant breakthroughs in all four of our service lines – orthopaedics, burns, spinal cord injury, and cleft lip and palate – improving the care and quality of life for countless children worldwide.

Shriners Hospitals for Children funds innovative research projects, special shared facilities, and training fellowships. The 2018 research budget is supporting a total of 148 grants (new, renewal, revision and continuation): 21 developmental research projects, 57 bench science projects, 24 clinical research projects. 24 Special Shared Facilities and 20 fellowships.

In addition to research grants, support is also provided for fellowships as a component of the organization's educational mission of training new researchers.

Research Emphasis and Direction

Today, our research efforts are focused on translational research, i.e. bench-to-bedside and bedside-to-bench research, and regenerative medicine. Although regenerative medicine is in its early stages, it has the potential to treat, reduce or eliminate the long-term causes of many of the conditions that affect our patients, including burns and other skin injuries, as well as orthopaedic and neuromuscular injury and disease. The field of regenerative medicine offers a unique chance for translational research, and a significant opportunity for personalized medicine for our patients.

We also continue to promote clinical research. We examine new treatment modalities, as well as outcomes associated with care, in order to continuously improve the clinical attention we give to our patients.

Partnerships Promote Our Goals

Our close affiliations with colleges and universities across the country allow us to enhance the quality and scope of our research. Relationships like those



with Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard Medical School, Oregon Health Sciences University, Washington University-St. Louis, Temple University, the University of California-Davis, University of Cincinnati, University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston, and many others help us meet our goals of improving clinical practice and pursuing fundamental scientific theories.

Research Projects

Examples of research underway throughout our health care system include projects in these areas:

- The genetics of metabolic bone disease
- The relationship between the ability to fight disease and genetic makeup
- The link between folate and spina bifida
- Effective strategies for repairing spinal cord injury
- The causes of cerebral palsy and effective therapies for its prevention and treatment
- Ways to grow new bone and cartilage using technology and therapies



Portland Shrine Hospital Report

The Portland Shrine Hospital had a slightly slower August with total outpatient surgeries matching the highest they have been all year but inpatient surgeries declining. Net patient revenue remains slightly under budget on a year to date basis and but total income is over \$600,000 higher than budget. We remain second only to NorCal in terms of net patient revenue. The number of patient days is the highest it has been in several years. Rehab services is still above budget.

We also measure the total draw on the endowment per patient, and have reached a point where it is the lowest it has ever been, drawing only \$605 per patient currently when it was nearly \$2,000 per patient in 2018.

The new clinic in Redmond, OR, as well as the Medford clinic, saw a slight decrease in the number of visits, primarily due to the range fires in the area, and the visits have rebounded in September. There is considerable community support in those areas for a clinic presence.
