



Salt Lake Shriners Children's Clinic

The Shriners Children's Clinic in Salt Lake City continues to work toward their mission of providing patients with "The Best Care Anywhere" and "Caring for More Kids in More Places".

In 2025, Shriners Children's Clinic in Salt Lake City will celebrate 100 years of service with a Gala event on May 10th. I will schedule a trip to Salt Lake for the celebration, and another trip for the Walk for Love in September. Please let me know if you are interested in attending either event.

The Philanthropy Department raised 134% of their goal for the year which will result in a much lower draw on the endowment than was predicted for 2024.

Dr. Kristin Carroll stepped down as the Medical Director of Shriners Children's Clinic in Salt Lake on November 1st. Dr. Theresa Hennessey has been selected as the Interim Medical Director until a new Medical Director can be found. Here is a summary of Dr. Carroll's work at Shriners Children's:

Kristen Carroll become interim chief of staff (COS) in early 2014 and became permanent COS later that year. Her role changed to Medical Director of SLC after our transition from a hospital to an outpatient clinic on September 1, 2021. During her tenure, she became a full professor at the University of Utah (UU) in 2015 and was also awarded the Sherman S Coleman presidential endowed chair in pediatric orthopedics in 2019. She served as a member of the physician executive team, then as a founding member of the Shriners Medical Group (SMG). She has been medical director of the SLC gait lab since 2014. She served as physician lead for research for the SMG for 4 years. This year she was awarded the UU faculty wide award for her work in equity and diversity for the UU.

She will step down as Medical Director from Shriners Children's SLC on November 1. 2024. She will continue to work as a staff physician, focusing primarily on children with neuromuscular disease, until 2026 which will mark her 30th year of service to Shriners Children's.

There were 74 clinics held in October and 809 unique patient visits. There were 56 surgical procedures performed and 4 infusions. There were 571 Therapy sessions, 28 Motion Analysis sessions, and 24 Locomat sessions. The Orthotics and Prosthetics Department delivered 327 Orthotics and 18 Prosthetics for a total of 345 devices delivered. The wheelchair department worked on 127 wheelchairs for the month.

- · A specialized treatment plan that minimizes scarring
- · The plan to get them back to their daily life with minimal disruptions

Improving Treatments and Saving Lives

The medical teams at our burns hospitals are renowned for their expertise in critical care, particularly in technique that may help save the life of a patient with severe burn injuries – such as fluid resuscitation, early excision and skin grafting, management of increased metabolism, medication responses and post-burn care.

Since Shriners Children's entered the burn care field, the survival rate for children with burns over more than 50 percent of their body surface has doubled. In addition, today, patients with burns over 90 percent can survive, and go on to lead full, productive lives.

Shriners Children's is a respected leader in the field of burn prevention and treatment. Physicians from all four of our burns hospitals have served as president of the American Burn Association. Our clinicians have published journal articles and book chapters that are widely regarded as primary sources for pediatric burn care treatment.

In order to provide the best, most innovative treatment to patients with burns and burn-related injuries, Shriners Children's is committed to research in burn care. Shriners conducts research studies involving different aspects of burn injury and treatment. Currently two of the clinical studies are multisite, involving Shriners Children's Boston as the lead site with our Texas and Northern California hospitals participating.



Our highly trained and experienced medical teams provide critical, surgical and rehabilitative care to children with varying degrees of new and healed burns, as well as burn-like conditions that can be treated with the same plastic, laser and reconstructive techniques used for burns. Specialized treatment is available for:

- · All levels and types of burn injuries
- · Skin grafting
- · Healed burns
- · Scarring that has caused contractures or limited mobility
- · Smoke inhalation
- · Facial scarring or deformities
- · Congenital hairy nevus
- · Port wine stains and hemangiomas
- · Complex skin conditions
- · Congenital ear deformities

Shriners Children's shares its expertise in burn care and research through academic affiliations with noteworthy institutions and through different medical outreach programs. Shriners Children's offers residency and fellowship programs, as well as opportunities for graduate students and postdoctoral researchers interested in this field.

Portland Shrine Hospital Report

The Portland Shrine Hospital had a robust October with the total number of inpatient and outpatient surgeries matching our highest month slightly slower August with total surgeries matching the highest they have been all year. Net patient revenue is slightly less than last year but continues to be second only to NorCal. The case mix adjusted Average Length of Stay (ALOS) is the lowest in the entire Shrine hospital system despite our acuity being among the highest for all Shrine hospitals. The number of rehabilitation visits was the highest it has been all year for October as well as being the highest it has been for any month over the past three years.

We also measure the total draw on the endowment per patient. We once again set a record for the lowest this metric has ever been, drawing only \$583 per patient

currently when it was nearly \$2,000 per patient in 2018.

We would like to remind everyone that we do not provide "free" care. We are contractually required to bill insurance companies (including Medicaid) if a patient has coverage and by law we must send a bill to the family. If a family is unable to pay, we cover the cost through the endowment. Payment is never a barrier to receiving care and treatment.

Twenty-three members, spouses, and guests from Gizeh Temple in Vancouver, BC jumped on a bus and visited the Portland Hospital on November 15! It was a great opportunity for them to see the hospital in person and some were there for the first time. Anyone who wants to tour the hospital is welcome to do so. Please reach out to Joe Randall or Rick Holloway to arrange it. The hospital prefers advance notice of tours by the Nobility and supporters so they can give them the best experience possible.



When I was a child, I would receive a small box of chocolates for Christmas from my aunt in Utah. She made the chocolates. The box would only have three or four pieces of candy, but I would look at them to see if I could figure out what each of the pieces of candy were.

The Masonic Family is like a very large box of chocolates. The foundation of the box is the 41 Masonic Lodges across the state of Idaho. This is the oldest Fraternal Organization in Idaho.

Inside the chocolate is brotherly love and the working tools, which include some type of charity within the community. All of the other pieces of chocolate are based on this foundation. The chocolates of DeMolay, Job's Daughters, Rainbow Girls, Eastern Star, Daughters of the Nile, Scottish Rite, York Rite and the Shriners. Like the Masonic Lodges, all these organizations are based on those core values.

For El Korah Shrine, that outer layer of sweetness is the parades and circuses that we are known for. If you ask the general population what they know about the Shriners, it is that outer layer. As the Black Light Patrol and Cameleers moved through the streets of Boise during the Veteran's Day Parade, we heard "Where are your little cars?" This is what the public knows about us, but like those chocolates, that is only the outer layer. Let's peel back that layer and look at our true mission, Helping Kids While Having Fun.

In 2021, El Korah sponsored 266 visits to one of the 22 Shriners Children's Hospitals at a cost of \$54,545.58 for travel.

In 2022, we sponsored 242 visits to our hospitals at a cost of \$47,996.40 for travel

In 2023, we sponsored 223 visits to those hospitals at a cost of \$79,337.24 for travel

Our chocolate's filling is all of the Idaho kids that we have helped get medical assistance over the past 102 years, which is when the Idaho El Korah Shriners began helping the kids of Idaho. In the past three years we have assisted with 731 visits. Just think about how many of the Shriner's Children are Idaho Kids. And we have been doing this for over 100 years!

This is only one piece of candy in this large box of chocolates called the Masonic Family.

We need to get our story out to the public. This Fraternal organization called the Masonic Family is the oldest and largest charitable organization in Idaho.

This year like last year, El Korah will remove a small piece of chocolate to reveal a small part of our organization through our efforts in conjunction with the December PBS Festival telethon. On the evening of December 7th, El Korah will be answering the telephones at PBS station.
