





El Korah Shrine is sitting at a fork in the road, asking for a decision about its future. The building on Idaho Street has been sold, which requires Clubs and Units to convene at various locations for meetings and functions. I am taking this opportunity to offer my opinion with respect to the building of a new structure, purchase of an existing structure, or constructing an addition to the existing MTA building.

The MTA Board of Directors has welcomed our joining the other bodies and erecting a building at the current location. The recently completed Feasibility Study confirms that it is in fact possible to add a structure at the Westgate location.

I favor the Westgate option for the following reasons:

- ➤ The Boise Masonic Lodges are here, as well as the York Rite Bodies. Locating the Shrine here brings us home to family.
- ► The Shrine can build a structure without purchasing land.
- ► The location has ample parking.
- ► The location is close to the Freeway and on the West side of the City of Boise.
- ➤ Our current alcohol license is in place which provides the opportunity of creating a new Oasis without purchasing a new license.
- ➤ Construction on the MTA site provides the best opportunity for a debt free building. This provides a better avenue for our Masonic Bodies to use the structure for activities. Renting of the building, would be a bonus not a necessity.
- ➤ Continuing to maintain only a Recorder's Office as the official location of the Shrine will result in nothing more than slow decay and eventual demise of El Korah Shrine.

This is my opinion. I would like to hear yours. An upcoming decision will determine our path forward as we work to grow and enjoy our Shrine.

You probably know this story about how the Sower casts his seeds and they land on different places, off the path, on rocky ground, in the weeds, and in good fertile soil, each with different results.

Jesus cast his seeds — his words of God and teachings — and they will fall many ways. My hope is that we each make our soil worthy of his words so that they may bear good fruit

This new year let us focus on more smiles, giving more positive compliments, and sharing your good fortune. Take time to read His word and be Thankful and Prayerful.

This reminds me of another of my favorite stories.

It was the coldest winter ever – so cold that many animals froze to death. In an effort to save themselves from this icy fate, the porcupines decided to gather together to fend off the chill.

They huddled close to each other, covered and protected from the elements, and warmed by their collective body heat. But their prickly quills proved to be a bit of a problem in close proximity – they poked and stabbed each other, wounding their closest companions

The warmth was wonderful, but the mutual needling became increasingly uncomfortable. Eventually, they began to distance themselves one from the other, scattering in the forest only to end up alone and frozen. Many died.

It soon became clear that they would have to choose between solitary deaths in the frigid wilderness and the discomfort of being needled by their companions' quills when they banded together.

Wisely, they decided to return to the huddle. They learned to live with the little wounds caused by the close relationship with their fellows.

Are we able to remind ourselves of the higher priority of our social connections? Who will hold your hand as you grow old? Who will sit with you in a doctor's waiting room as you wait to hear the outcome?

Our lives come with inevitable contentions. Our own hurts and wants butt up against those we are closest to, wanting them to be the one to remind us that we are loved and connected, no matter how prickly we are acting.

- 3 People are not perfect. Accepting and living with our own imperfections as well as those of others, is one of the greatest gifts we can give ourselves and those close to us. Seek to eliminate blame from your life as much as possible.
- 4 A little needling can be a good thing. Being poked by those we love can cause us to separate and look closer at our own quills.
- 5 Learn to live with the pricks in your life they may be serving some higher purpose.

Salt Lake Shriners Children's Clinic

The Shriners Children's Clinic in Salt Lake City continues to work toward their mission of providing patients with "The Best Care Anywhere" and "Caring for More Kids in More Places".

In 2025, Shriners Children's Clinic in Salt Lake City will celebrate 100 years of service with a Gala event on May 10th at the Eccles Alumni House. I will be scheduling trips to Salt Lake for the 100-year celebration and the Walk for Love that will be held in September. Please let me know if you are interested in attending either event.

The Philanthropy Department has raised 145% of their annual goal as of November 31, a 77% increase from 2023,

which will result in a much lower draw on the endowment than was predicted for 2024.

There were 72 clinics held in November and 733 unique patient visits. There were 45 surgical procedures performed and 3 infusions. There were 584 Therapy sessions, 31 Motion Analysis sessions, and 26 Locomat sessions. The Orthotics and Prosthetics Department delivered 373 orthotics and 18 prosthetics for a total of 391 devices delivered. The wheelchair department worked on 139 wheelchairs for the month.

In the Northwest Market (Portland, Spokane, and Salt Lake), there were 895 new patient visits for a YTD total of 11,185. Salt Lake had 101 for November and 1,322 YTD.

Portland Shrine Hospital Report

The December 2024 Board meeting was held earlier than normal due to Christmas. The annual Board Christmas party was held at Al Kader Shrine on Sunday, December 15 which included recognition of my attaining Emeritus status from nine years of service on the Board of Governors.

The Portland Hospital continued a strong fourth quarter with total inpatient and outpatient surgeries matching our highest month ever. Net patient revenue remains very close to last year's totals and is still second only to NorCal. Perhaps the most remarkable statistic is the fact our donations (which were approximately \$1.2 million per year when I started on the Board in 2016) have surpassed the \$5 million threshold.

As I am leaving the Board as a regular Board member, I wish to thank the members of El Korah who consistently supported my representation of El Korah on the Portland Board over the years. Ill. Sir Joe Randall will be the sole representative of El Korah on the Board beginning January 1, 2025 so he will be writing these reports beginning with the February 2025 Desert Dust. If you are interested in running for the Board, please talk to Joe or any of the former Board members about the experience. From my perspective, there are few things any of us can do as Shriners that is more supportive of our mission than serving on the Board for a Shrine Hospital.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is Dedicated to Spinal Cord Injury Rehabilitation



Sustaining a spinal cord injury (SCI) can be a frightening, overwhelming experience. A spinal cord injury can affect every function of the body.

There are 12,000 new cases of spinal cord injury in the U.S. each year, and approximately 10 percent affect children under age 16. Automobile crashes are the leading cause of spinal cord injury.

In addition to providing expert medical and rehabilitative care for a patient with a spinal cord injury, it is critically important for caregivers to be aware of and meet the developmental, social and educational needs of children and adolescents with these injuries in order to ensure they have the best opportunity for a full, satisfying life. Accordingly, in the mid-1980s, Shriners Hospitals for Children® established the nation's first spinal cord injury rehabilitation and management programs specifically designed for children and teenagers.

Patients participating in these programs – available at the Shriners Hospitals for Children in Chicago, Philadelphia and Sacramento, Calif. – receive the complete range of services needed in order to recover to the fullest extent possible.

As is true of all care offered at Shriners Hospitals for Children, the SCI rehabilitation program is family-centered and interdisciplinary, offering each patient a complete, easily accessible care program. The treatment team includes a variety of surgeons and other physicians, nurses, therapists, therapeutic recreation specialists, psychologists, social workers, and dieticians.

Innovative therapy efforts include body-weight supported manual treadmill training or robotic treadmill training with the Lokomat, a device that automates movement therapy and improves the efficiency of treadmill training in patients with neurological movement disorders, such as spinal cord injury. Both of these therapies provide weight-bearing opportunities and can help stimulate muscles and build strength and stamina. Some of our hospitals also offer robotic assisted gait training via the ReWalk exoskeleton system.

In addition to therapy, exercise and activity-based rehabilitation, including aqua therapy, pet therapy and adaptive sports, is emphasized. These activities build strength and stamina and increase social interaction, confidence and independence. Some of the hospitals also offer specialty camps emphasizing aspects of health, fitness and independence.

In order to provide the best, most innovative care possible, Shriners Hospitals for Children is involved in several research efforts involving SCI. These include quality of life studies and studies to understand the complexities of regenerating the spinal cord.

Shriners Hospitals for Children shares its expertise in pediatric spinal cord injury rehabilitation through academic affiliations at prestigious nearby institutions, such as Rush Medical College in Chicago, University of California Davis and Temple University in Philadelphia, and through various medical outreach programs.

While the health care system provides this expert care regardless of a family's ability to pay, the organization depends on the generosity of donors to support its mission of caring for children. To learn how you can help, please visit donate2SHC.org.
