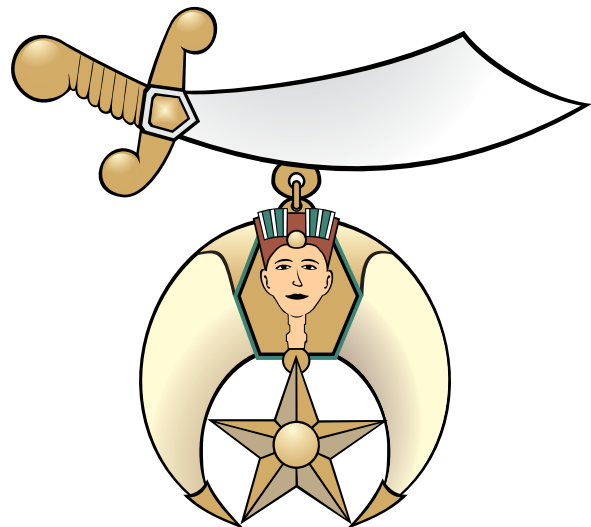
2025 Shrine Dues were due by **12/31/24**.

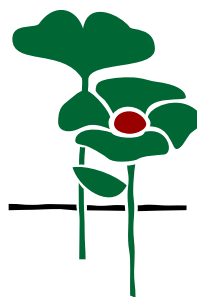

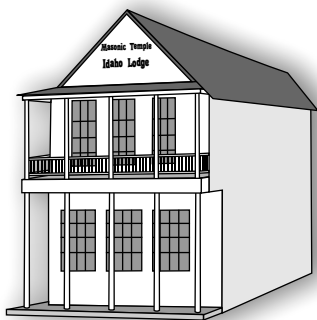
What are the Shriners?

In Idaho, the oldest and largest Fraternal Organization is the Masonic Family of Organizations, with the oldest being the Masonic Lodges. There are 41 Masonic Lodges throughout Idaho with each of them building on the basic belief in Faith, Hope and Charity.

Faith in themselves, their fellow man, and a Supreme Architect of the Universe. Hope in a better world without war or bloodshed, and with Faith and Hope comes Charity for our fellowman.

These have been practiced in each communities since the Masons arrived in Idaho in 1864 and founded the Idaho City Lodge, which is now called Idaho Lodge #1. The first Masonic Lodge was founded in 1863, but the building is no longer standing.

From these Lodges, youth organizations were formed; DeMolay, Rainbow for Girls, and Job's Daughters, with most of their charitable work focused on the community's youth.

Other parts of this Masonic Family are the Eastern Star and Daughters of the Nile, which are both women's organizations. The Scottish Rite Bodies and the York Rite Bodies are both men's organizations. All these organizations are charity-based for the betterment of our youth.

In July 1891, Boise received its Dispensation to create a Shrine and in November 1896, El Korah Shriners was formed. In 1907, the first El Korah Parade Unit, the

Black Light Patrol, was formed and active and El Korah has either sponsored or been in most Southern Idaho parades since then. The public knows El Korah as the guys with the funny cars and the circus animals. But what is not seen is the assistance that El Korah provides to the children of Idaho with the twenty-two Shriners Children's Hospitals and Clinics. The first Hospital opened in 1922 in Shreveport, Louisiana. The hospitals in Portland, Salt Lake and Spokane opened around 1924.

El Korah assists Idaho kids by referring those in need to a hospital to deal with skeletal issues, burns and other life altering problems. El Korah role is aid with travel costs and support.

Helping Kids While Having Fun!

In 2021, El Korah sponsored 266 visits to one of the 22 the Shriners Children's Hospitals at a cost of \$54,545.58 for travel.

In 2022, we sponsored 242 visits to those hospitals at a cost of \$47,996.40 for travel.

In 2023, we sponsored 223 visits to those hospitals at a cost of \$79,337.24 for travel.

That is a total of 731 visits in three years. Just think of all the Idaho kids that El Korah has helped get medical assistance and improve their lives over the past 102 years. Without El Korah, who would have supported those Idaho Kids?

El Korah is a 503-c-10 organization, so donations go to support El Korah in Idaho as a "not-for-profit" entity, but the value of this organization to those kids makes the extra effort of supporting El Korah worthwhile.

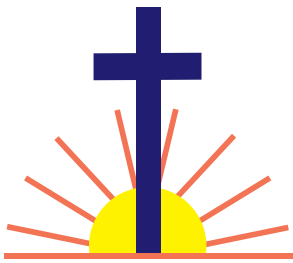

I will be assuming the task of writing the Portland Shrine Hospital Report from Ill Sir Rick Holloway beginning this month. Rick has attained Emeritus status after serving nine years on the board and will be missed for his outstanding knowledge of medicine and health care management. Rick has a Master's Degree in Health Care Management plus years of experience in the health care field and has shared his knowledge with the Portland Board. This made him a perfect fit for the Portland Board!!!

During his tenure, which included two years as Chairman of the Portland Hospital Board, the Portland hospital has gone from a middle of the road ranking to being one of the top ranked Shriners Hospitals. While Rick was not responsible for all of our hospital improvements, he certainly had a "healthy" impact on improving them.

One of the significant achievements was hiring top-of-the-

line executives to help with strategic planning and to run the hospitals day to day operations. This year we will have the lowest per patient draw on our endowment ever, which represents a very efficient hospital operation! We will miss you, Rick!!!!!!

We will not have our final statistics for 2024 until our January meeting later this month. Year to date our Portland Hospital continues with strong growth. Our number of inpatient and outpatient surgeries continue to increase. One statistic that is truly outstanding is our donations which will increase well over one million dollars from last year.

The Portland Hospital continues to receive outstanding recognition. We received the Press Ganey Guardian of Excellence Award for IPU Patient Satisfaction. Our Surgical Services department received national recognition from Press Ganey by scoring in the 99th percentile from patient referrals.

Our Redmond Clinic, Medford Clinic, and walk-in Clinic continue to see record growth. Medford is now open on Friday afternoons and all-day Saturday.

Meet Alec, Shriners Hospitals for Children Superstar

You may recognize 15-year-old Alec from the various commercials for Shriners Hospitals for Children® that have aired nationally. Alec, a patient of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago, has become a popular television star, been interviewed on numerous national news and talk shows, and has captured the hearts of many with his adorable smile and charming personality.

The Story Behind the Star

Alec lives in the suburbs of Chicago, and is quite the active teenager. From playing wheelchair softball and basketball, to assistant coaching tee-ball, he loves just about any sport. However, because he has Osteogenesis Imperfecta (OI), also known as brittle bone disease, Alec's approach to his favorite activities is a little different.

OI is a genetic bone disorder characterized by fragile bones that can frequently and easily break, which can make it hard for Alec to participate in sports. The underlying cause of OI is a lack of collagen – or abnormal collagen – in the bones that prevents them from absorbing appropriate minerals and developing correctly. As a patient of the Chicago Shriners Hospital, Alec receives intravenous (IV) infusions of pamidronate, a medication that slows down the process of bone resorption and improves bone mass. He also routinely visits the hospital for physical therapy.

Thanks to the outstanding care and innovative treatment Alec receives at the Chicago Shriners Hospital, his muscles are strengthening and his bones are breaking less often. This provides Alec with more opportunities to indulge in his passion for sports. Alec often participates in up to four hours of sports a day; his mother, Alma, works hard to ensure his homework and physical therapy are done, as well.

They manage to fit it all in. Alec has been coming to the Chicago Shriners Hospital for treatment since 2002. Since then, he has made great progress thanks to his customized treatment with our rehabilitation specialists.

Alec's mom is grateful for the excellent care her son has received. "If there is a number system to rate the hospital from one to 10, I'd give it a 16," she said. "They are always working with him and pushing him to work hard."

Currently, Alec is building more strength and increasing muscle development through aquatic therapy. The hospital's therapists work with Alec in a temperature-controlled hydrotherapy pool using aquatic treadmills and other equipment. Tapping into Alec's love for sports, his therapist has even incorporated water basketball into rehabilitation sessions.

The hospital also helped provide Alec with a customized, adaptive bicycle. While riding the bike is fun, it also helps strengthen his muscles, to help prevent future bone fractures.

According to Alma, these unique treatments, specifically designed for Alec, have allowed him to gain more independence. He continues to work on increasing his mobility.



Shriners Hospitals for Children – Helping Dreams Become Reality

Thanks to the health care system's focus on improving the quality of life of patients and families, Alec has developed a level of confidence that has opened up a world of opportunities. Knowing that Alec hopes to be a sports broadcaster someday, the hospital staff has done what it can to encourage faith in that dream.

During the NFL Draft weeks in 2015 and 2016, patients of the Chicago Shriners Hospital had the chance to experience the excitement of the draft first-hand when players visited during a Prospect Community Visit. As a special surprise, Alec was given the opportunity to conduct interviews with NFL Draft prospects, which were featured on the NFL website.

Alec has also appeared in national commercials for Shriners Hospitals for Children, representing the many patients whose lives have been changed forever by the health care system. Alec is a great voice for Shriners Hospitals for Children, and continues to share his appreciation everywhere he goes.

"Without Shriners Hospitals for Children, I wouldn't be able to dream as big as I do," said Alec. "I know anything is possible because the staff remind me all the time that I can do whatever I set my mind to. I live a full life because of Shriners Hospitals."

Alec is just one of the more than 1.3 million children who have benefited from the hope and healing found at Shriners Hospitals for Children.
